The government argues that because private sector pension schemes have been scandalously stripped away by highly-paid executives, it's only 'fair' that this happens in the public sector as well.

This does not make any sense. An equality of misery helps none of us, we say there should be fair pensions for everyone – public, private and state pensions.

Public servants are not a drain on our economy, as some would have you believe. They are our nurses and doctors, our children's teachers, the people who help the unemployed find work – the people who look after us from cradle to grave.

The government is making us all pay for a crisis caused by the banks. Let's tell them we don't accept this and we want fair pensions for all.

Yes. Union members agreed a deal in 2007 which, the National Audit Office said last year, "reduces costs to taxpayers by 14 per cent".

In Lord Hutton's review he said the cost of public sector pensions would fall 0.5% as a share of national wealth by 2060. This May MPs on the public accounts committee found no proof that pensions were not sustainable.
